What does a fair twin transition look like in practice – and who gets to shape it?

Over the past year, READJUST has moved from analysis to engagement, bringing together researchers, policymakers, public transport actors and agri-food stakeholders to explore how digital and green transitions can become more inclusive.

By welcoming **4CF – The Futures Literacy Company** as a new partner, the project has strengthened its future-oriented policy work, expanding its foresight capacity and testing policy concepts against plausible 2050 scenarios. At the same time, READJUST has continued to build its evidence base through activities and surveys that capture real-world experiences, practical challenges and emerging needs across the agri-food and mobility sectors. The new READJUST Community further opened a space for exchange, helping policymakers, experts and practitioners contribute to the project's ongoing work.

This second newsletter issue looks back on READJUST's progress from April 2025 to March 2026, highlighting project outputs and deliverables, co-creation workshops and exchanges with sister initiatives, while also looking ahead to the next steps in building fairer, more participatory transition policies.

New: READJUST 2050 scenario videos now online

To support stakeholder engagement and futures-oriented policy reflection, READJUST has published four short scenario videos that translate the WP1 “Twin Transition 2050” scenarios into immersive, jargon-free narratives for the mobility and agri-food sectors. The videos are designed as “*boundary objects*” to help audiences move from abstract agreement to a more concrete understanding of the trade-offs and inequality risks embedded in different transition pathways, strengthening Futures Literacy for policy discussions.

- **Fragmented Efficiency** – market-led progress in enclaves, deepening inequality and “climate poverty”
- **The Managed Utopia** – technocratic efficiency with universal access, but reduced autonomy
- **The Mosaic of Resilience** – decentralised self-sufficiency prioritising resilience over cohesion
- **The Deliberative Commons** – values-driven transformation through deliberation and ecological regeneration

Project highlights

Helsinki workshop: READJUST collaborates with Helsinki Region Transport (HSL) on just logistics transition

READJUST is working with the Helsinki Regional Transport Authority (HSL) to support a fair shift in logistics towards alternative propulsion systems such as biogas and electric vehicles. The collaboration includes a survey of logistics companies to identify needs and barriers, followed by stakeholder co-creation workshops in 2026 to develop solutions and policy recommendations.

Co-creation in action: electrifying urban logistics in Vitoria-Gasteiz

READJUST held its first co-creation session with logistics stakeholders in Vitoria-Gasteiz on 15 April, focusing on the transition towards electric urban delivery fleets. The workshop explored both practical implementation barriers and the justice and equality impacts of electrification across different types of operators. See below some early takeaways:

- **Delivery segments matter:** electrification was still seen as difficult for certain use cases—especially **temperature-controlled** and other **specialised freight**.
 - **Policy incentives feel uneven:** stakeholders perceived stronger support for electrifying **public passenger transport** than for **urban freight and logistics** fleets.
 - **Equity risks for smaller operators:** larger logistics companies had begun transitioning, while **SMEs and self-employed operators** faced greater disadvantages due to high upfront investment costs for fleet renewal.

Several key READJUST reports are now available on the Project Deliverables page, covering policy processes, co-creation, data management, and the new 2050 scenarios for mobility and agri-food.

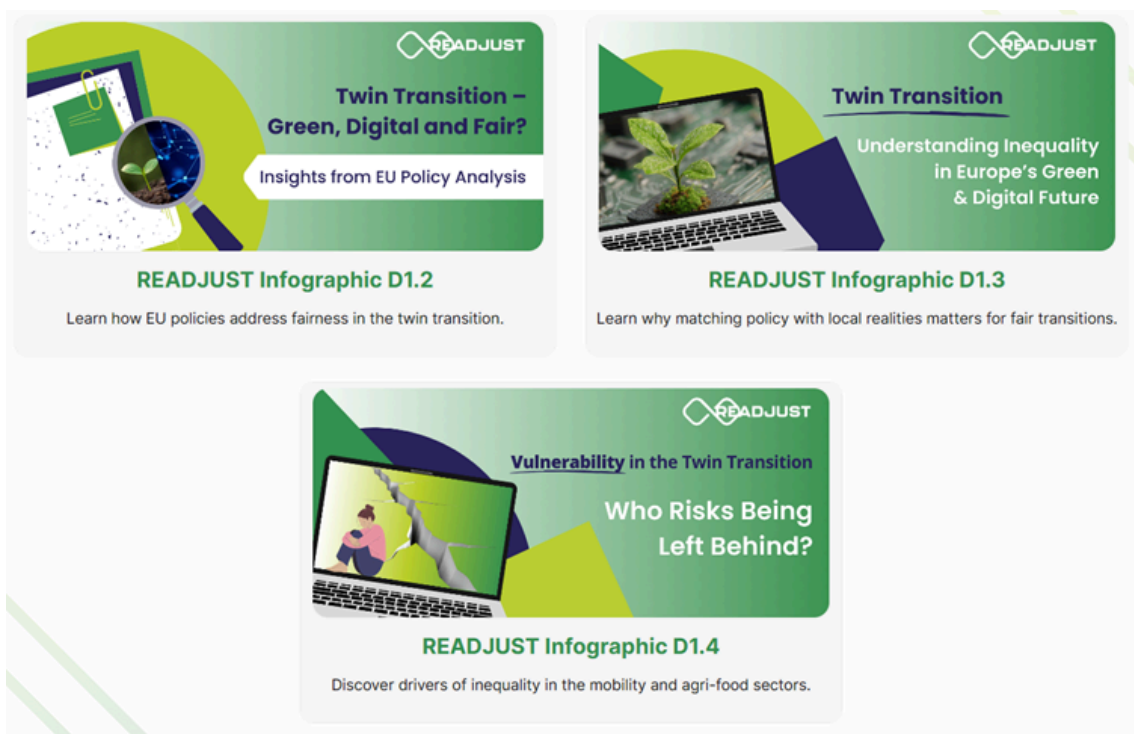
Latest 2026 reports:

- **Policy Briefs: Policy recommendations for advancing a just transition in the current policy** – introduces the policy-process lens READJUST will use in 2026, focusing on SUMP (Helsinki, Vitoria-Gasteiz) and Soil Monitoring Law implementation (Poland, Ibiza/regenerative agriculture).
- **Co-creation of policy measures report – stakeholder analysis and engagement plan** – presents the READJUST Framework for Just Policy Co-Creation and how it will be applied in case studies (2026–2027).
- **Data Management Plan – 1st update** – updates the consortium’s FAIR and governance approach and reflects project progress and the integration of the new Hop-On partner.

- **Twin Transition 2050: Scenarios for Mobility and Agrifood** – four future scenarios (Fragmented Efficiency, Managed Utopia, Mosaic of Resilience, Deliberative Commons) to support foresight-informed, inequality-aware policymaking.

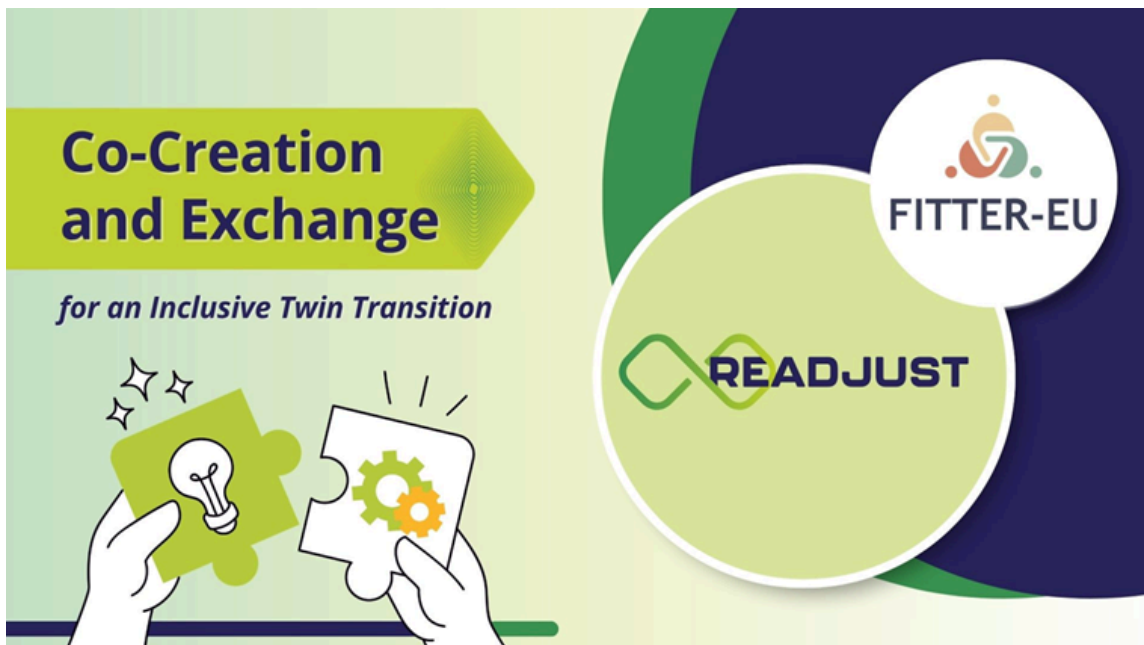
